Continuing Education Courses Held Monthly

Thank you to everyone who attended our October continuing education (CE) trainings. Last month, we hosted two virtual sessions and had a fantastic turnout! As a reminder, licensed professionals (social workers, counselors, and RNs) **MUST attend the LIVE training sessions** in order to receive professional CEs. Non-licensed providers can attend either the live training or view the recorded training. Certificates of completion will be emailed within 7 business days after the training and the required course evaluation, if applicable, has been successfully completed. CE Certificates will only be provided to those who attend a minimum of 55 minutes of the 1-hour long training. This leaves a 5-minute grace period for those who may be late joining the live session.

As a provider, you are expected to understand and contribute to the person-centered planning process. You are also expected to provide services as dictated by the process. Navigating Nursing: Home Health, Private Duty, Waiver Nursing Service and RN Consultation/Assessment Requirements

Wednesday 11/30/2022 2:00 pm via Teams Webinar

This training provides a deep dive into the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rules that govern how providers of Home Health, Private Duty, Waiver Nursing and RN consultation and assessment must furnish services to individuals. Knowing and understanding the various rules will help ensure the health and welfare of Waiver individuals and improve provider skills and abilities in their daily functions. In this training you will learn how to:

Making a Difference

Updates on Ohio Provider Expansion Project Activities

To close out November's issue, we are excited to introduce **"Making a Difference"** a regular article highlighting how ODM and PCG have partnered to address the critical shortage of in-home service providers in Ohio. Tune in each month for updates on project activities and other important topics related to Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS).

As you know, Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services allows Medicaid-eligible individuals with disabilities and/or long-term care needs to lead independent lives at home by receiving care in their homes and communities, as opposed to nursing facilities, hospitals, or rehabilitation facilities, which are often more costly and less integrated. Eligible individuals rely on a network of in-home service providers to remain healthy and safe in their homes and communities. These providers perform duties that range from assisting with activities of daily living, including bathing, dressing, feeding, light housework, shopping, and meal preparation to medication administration, health maintenance, and skilled nursing care.

According to the <u>United States Department of Labor, Bureau for Labor Statistics</u>, Personal and Home Care Aides are the fastest growing occupation in both Ohio and the country. The number of Personal and Home Care Aides needed in Ohio is projected to increase by over 180,300 (a 32% annual increase!) between 2020 and 2030 according to <u>PHI</u>. These positions offer ease of entry to rewarding work with high degrees of flexibility, mobility, job security, and opportunities for career advancement. Immediate openings are available for agency providers (employees) as well as independent providers across Ohio.

In 2021, ODM began partnering with PCG to help address recruitment and retention of inhome service providers. PCG has been conducting ODM Provider Oversight functions since 2013, including enrolling providers and conducting on-site visits, structural reviews, critical incident investigations, provider occurrence investigations, and provider training. This experience provides us with a thorough understanding of home and communitybased services in Ohio and the growing provider shortage that has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ohio Provider Expansion project activities are designed to support individual Medicaid beneficiaries and the vast network of agencies, agency providers, and independent providers who serve them.

- Activities in support of individuals include conducting surveys and focus groups, assisting with emergency provider recruitment, and providing training and materials to help individuals recruit and retain qualified in-home service providers.
- Activities in support of independent providers include monthly information sessions for prospective providers, recruiting activities, enrollment assistance, training, continuing education, and an independent provider mentorship program to pair new enrollees with seasoned providers.
- Activities in support of agencies include assisting with Medicaid enrollment and operational readiness assessment and consulting to support expansion and entering new markets.

Online resources available through PCG include recruitment materials for individuals, enrollment success videos and training materials for providers, and a crosswalk comparing ODM requirements for agencies with other Home and Community-Based Services in Ohio. **Coming Soon!** – PCG Match, an online directory connecting individuals in need of services with available providers.

Our team looks forward to providing an even stronger network of support and resources to new and tenured in-home services providers to further enhance the delivery of HCBS Waiver services and ensure the health and welfare of individuals across the State.



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
